President's Address

In reviewing the past year, Peter Wilson spoke of the achievements of the Branch. He referred to the ceremony of dedicating the new Standard, the unique "twinning" with the Toledo Post of the American Legion, our involvement in the Carnival, the Remembrance Day Service and Parade, the Two minutes Silence and the superb results of the Poppy Appeal.

I, too was encouraged by what had been achieved, including the very welcome 19 new members who joined the Branch during the 1996197 Membership year. The present strength is 94.

But I spoke of my disappointment at the small proportion of members who have come to normal Branch meetings. To help those for whom transport may be a problem, Gordon Adnett kindly offered to use the Community Vehicle. Other members are also willing to offer lifts. Ring me if you need help.

Some members have found Branch meetings dull, too long, lacking in camaraderie, even prone to bickering. We need to make the evenings more appealing. Please tell me what you think should be done.

Treasurer's Report

The way in which the Accounts were presented was intended to emphasise the distinction between funds which can only be used for (mainly) Welfare and those used to operate the Branch as a group of members. The "Operating a/c" showed how reliant we were on Donations.

The Audit of the Treasurer's records and the Summary a/c which has to be submitted to HQ, showed that all was in order and that Branch finances are in a satisfactory state. On that basis the Accounts were formally approved.

Poppy Appeal

As Poppy Appeal organiser, Peter Wilson reported another record result with income to date of over £10,000, which is more than 10% up on this time last year, itself a record. He thanked everyone who bad helped with the considerable effort involved and gave particular praise for the work undertaken by Renie and Dick Fulford.

On a proposal from Peter Wilson, Mr Stan Snow, President of the former Welland Valley Branch, was invited to fill the new Office of Second Vice President. Thank you Stan for accepting.
