

The Entertainments Committee are to be congratulated on the success of the outing on 20th April which they had arranged. The coach,



John Cox & George Fleming took part in the recent display in Lutterworth of Leicestershire Standard Beaters.


Finance

Accounts submitted to the AGM in January, covered the year ending 30th September, 1995. It was explained that although Branch assets were mainly in the form of investment accounts, RBL rules restrict the way in which interest & capital may be used, e.g. the Trust / Welfare a/c may only be used for clearly defined welfare purposes. The result is that the Branch does not use any of its capital for its activities (except Welfare), but relies heavily on subscriptions & fund-raising.
