Kris Hopkins MP the Minister for housing recently met with Veterans Association UK discuss the problems that some former Service personnel are finding it difficult to access social housing because they are not being given appropriate priority. Under section 169 of the Housing Act 1996 local authorities are required to have regard guidance issued by the Secretary of State. Unfortunately do to the wording in this document; a few Councils have interpreted it to suit themselves. The statutory guidance provides examples of ways in which local authorities that appropriate can ensure priority is provided.
