We are excited to announce that the Legion has secured funding from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust for the **Legion Links Project**. The aim will be to create a national network of social groups offering support to carers in the Armed Forces community, to help them feel less lonely and isolated because of their caring role.

Each group will be coordinated and led by a team of volunteers, consisting of two new roles: **Support Group Facilitators** and **Admin Support**. The Legion Links volunteers will support carers in the Armed Forces community by facilitating face-to-face social groups, with the option of virtual social groups also available.

The project will establish groups in 20 locations across England, Wales, and Northern Ireland.

We would like to encourage our Members to communicate this new project to their wider network – whether that be to potential volunteers, or carers in the Armed Forces community who would benefit from the project. We would also warmly welcome volunteer applications from our Members.
