Annual Conference 2022 from 13-15 May in London




Join our Membership Town Hall on 28 April at 6pm

Falklands 40

This month marks 40 years since the Falklands war started. One of the biggest conflicts since WW2, it lasted 74 days with 255 British personnel losing their lives defending the Falklands. 30,000 sailors, marines, airmen, soldiers and merchant mariners took part in the conflict that ended with the surrender of the Argentine forces on 14 June 1982.

Going back in time



From the Royal British Legion Magazine December 1947

When an eviction order was sought against the wife of a paralysed ex-regular soldier, never to walk again, the Legion stepped in to support the family. The paralysed soldier was in hospital and the wife's only income came from looking after a foster child but she owed £21 arrears of rent. Lt.-Col. Crafter of the Legion attended court and on behalf of the Legion promised to clear off the arrears and save the family from eviction. The Judge said 'I think in this case the British Legion has proved itself a friend in need.'
