The RBL Festival of Remembrance - Membership Ticketing

The Festival of Remembrance will be held in the Royal Albert Hall, London, on Saturday 11 November 2023 with performances at 2pm and 7pm. In an exclusive deal, members can buy tickets - on a first-come first-served basis - directly from the ticket agent, See Tickets. Please note that tickets will only be available to buy online. Members should use the [online portal](#) to buy tickets and use the [See Tickets Support Centre](#) if they need help.

Tuesday 25 July: Evening tickets go on sale at 10am. RBL members can purchase up to two tickets for the evening performance.

Tuesday 1 Aug: Afternoon tickets go on sale at 10am. RBL members can purchase up to four tickets for the afternoon performance.

Tickets, including accessible seating, should be booked online, through See Tickets, using the seat picker. Payment will be taken at the time of booking. We're sorry, but we can't accept postal applications. No ticket will be issued before full ticket holder details are received. Once confirmed, tickets are non-returnable or refundable. You can change the name of your guest before 31 October by visiting the Customer Service page on the See Tickets website. Members can purchase tickets for either the evening or afternoon performance, not both.

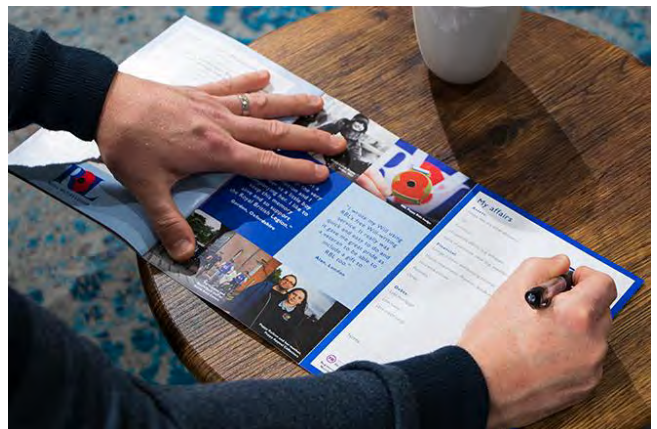

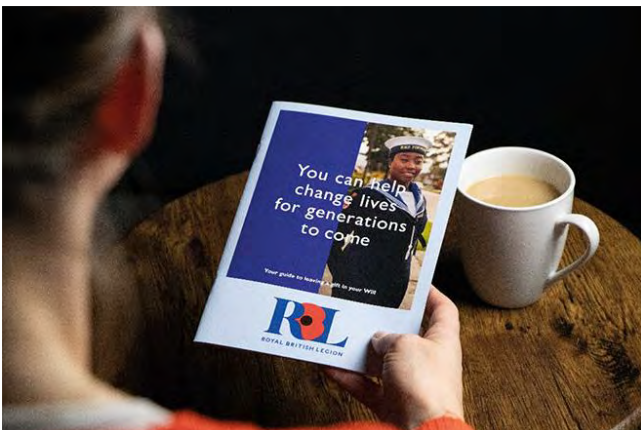

Armed Forces compensation (such as a War Pension) is often considered an income source when national and local benefit rates are calculated, whilst civil compensation is not. Veterans and their families are often receiving less Pension Credit, Housing Benefit, Council Tax Support, Discretionary Housing Payments, and Disabled Facilities Grants than they are entitled to. 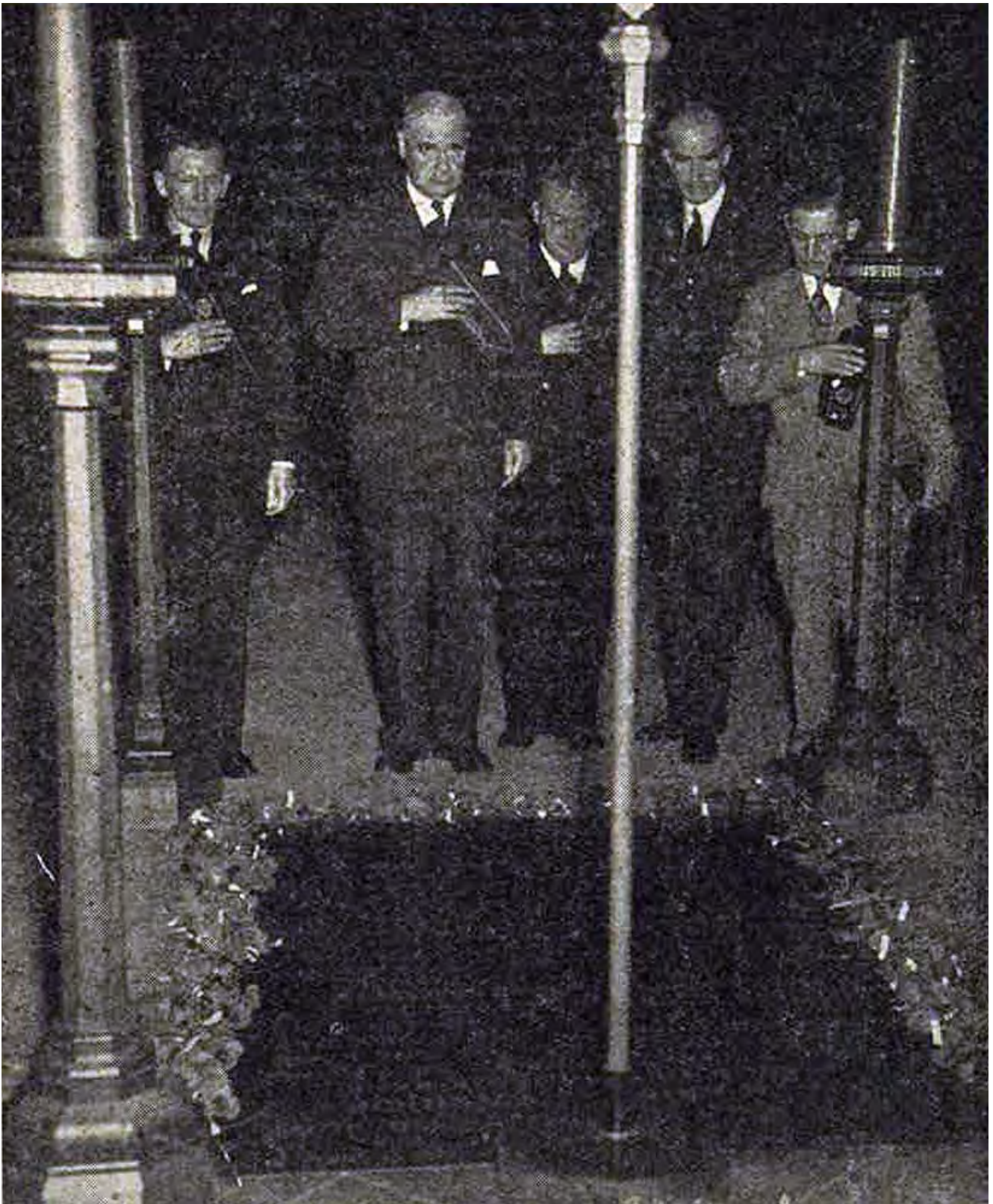

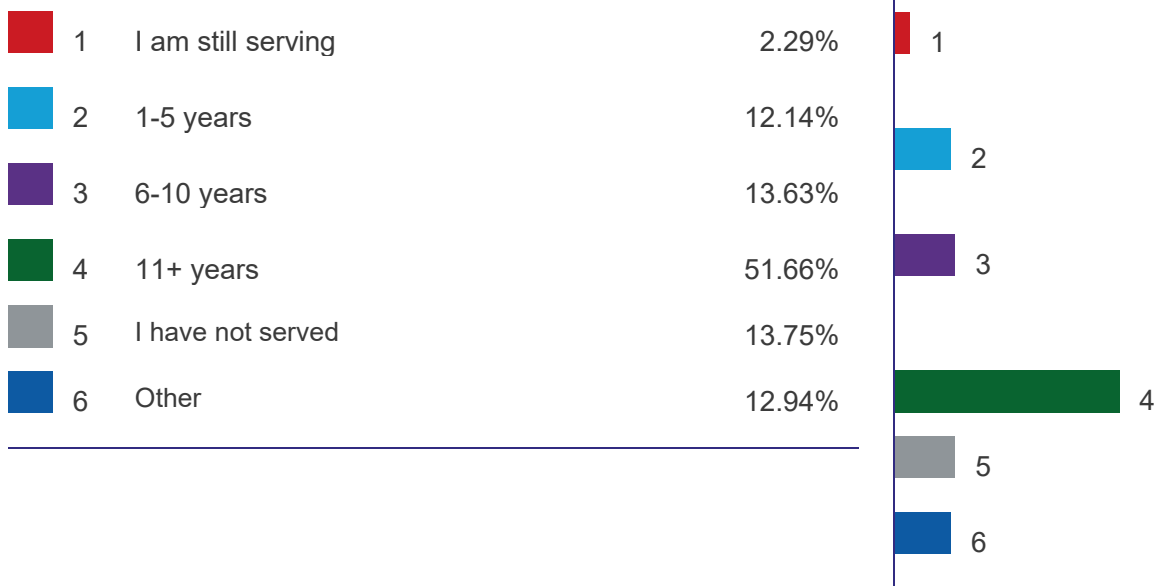
