Introducing our plastic-free poppy. In our commitment to reducing single-use plastic, we're pleased to share that our poppy will now be made entirely from paper. Reducing carbon emissions in production by 40% compared to the previous design, our new poppy is made from a blend of renewable fibres from responsible sources — 50% recycled waste from the production of coffee cups and 50% responsibly sourced wood fibre. The new poppy will be available for the 2023 Poppy Appeal.


