The RBL Honours Committee welcomes nominations for a National Award for Legion members, volunteers and staff, whose contribution to RBL goes further than is normally expected. The overriding principle is that awards should be made on merit, defined as achievement and exceptional service. Nominators should consider candidates who have made successful changes, with the emphasis on specific achievement; have demonstrated innovation and, where appropriate, leadership, which has delivered outstanding results.
