D Day 80th Commemorations

Many of you will have seen the excellent coverage on the TV for the D Day 80th commemorations. Commemorations in Stamford were organised by Stamford Town Council and included an evening of displays, entertainment and the lighting of the beacon.

Stamford RBL were invited to lead the remembrance aspect of the commemorations. Under the direction of the branch padre, Reverend Peter Stevenson, veterans, armed forces cadets, civic dignitaries and members of the public remembered those that served and continued to serve with prayers and a moments silence.

The branch held a D Day display and sold pin badges, including the new RBL 80 Poppy pin badge. There was much interest from the public and it was great to finally meet some more of the branch membership.

Our stand raised a total of £89.83 for branch funds (the 80th pin badge money goes to the poppy fund and is not included in this figure).

Our branch president made the following statement: ...`I would be most grateful if you could pass on my congratulations to all those who participated in yesterday's Activities on the Stamford Recreation Ground. It was a very good turnout of our Veterans and under Shaun's strict control they did us proud. 2071 Squadron receives Kings Award

Stamford 2071 squadron recently was awarded the Kings Award for Voluntary Service.

The Kings Award for Voluntary Service is the highest award any voluntary organisation can receive - Stamford Air Cadets is one of a handful of hundreds of Cadet squadrons to receive it, and the only one in Lincolnshire.

Stamford Town Hall played host to the presentation of the certificate for service from the Lord Lieutenant for Lincolnshire, Mr Toby Dennis on Wednesday 26th June. Members of the RBL were invited and included our youth officer and president. 2071 squadron are affiliated to the Stamford RBL branch.

The whole branch wishes to congratulate the squadron on its achievements and for receiving this prestigious award.

Armed Forces Day

The Armed Forces Day Flag was raised outside the town hall on Friday 28th June in a short ceremony attended by the Mayor, councillors, representatives of RAF Wittering and members of the Royal British Legion. Rev. Fr. Neil Shaw, the Mayor's Chaplain, gave an Armed Forces reading, and Caroline Avnit, Stamford's poet laureate, read a poem to the assembled guests.

As part of the celebrations the Stamford branch held a stall within the Stamford high street on Saturday 29th June, which promoted the work of the RBL and encouraged individuals to join the branch.

As with the D Day commemorations there was much interest and it was great to talk to veterans, some current RBL members and some not. During the day we received a small amount of donations, to the value of around £50, which is for branch funds.

One of the main reasons for holding these public displays is to raise awareness as a Stamford community charity and to build community partnerships.









RBL Subscriptions

You will all have received communication from membership services of the increase to RBL subscriptions from October this year.

The RBL membership will increase by £2 each year, for the next 5 years.

On top of this subscription, local branches can amend their joining fee, which for Stamford is currently £1. Recently the committee was asked by Haig House to review this fee and it was decided to keep the branch membership subscription at £1 for 2024/25.

This would mean that from September subscription fees for the RBL will be £21 (£20 for Haig House and £1 for Stamford) in total.
