County News

Hampshire County Welfare Fund

Dear Members

You will see regular calls from me to your Branches asking for donations to the County Welfare Fund.

Since its implementation in 2002 each County actively asks Branches to donate surplus funds into its respective County Welfare Fund.

In Hampshire, this is an earmarked fund for Welfare cases in Hampshire.

Only cases in this County benefit from the funds in our County Welfare Fund and because this is an earmarked fund, it cannot be used for anything else.

The need for regular donations increases every year as cases are becoming more complex and need multiple agencies to support each case.

For the avoidance of doubt as to the importance of these regular requests, I have some statistics for you to consider:

Since October 2014 there have been 961 Welfare requests for funding that have come through your County Committee, this has totalled **£482,346**.

For the same period, we have only been able to contribute **£169,299** towards to these cases.

I cannot stress how important regular donations to the County Welfare fund is.

The surplus Branch funds you donate will **only** go to cases in Hampshire, these are people in **your** community, vulnerable, and in need of our help. Please raise this at your next Branch meeting, the County Welfare Fund is vital, and if in doubt, please call on me and my Committee to visit your Branch to talk to all your members and officers.

However, I have identified that there is an immediate requirement for both Branch Management and Branch Treasurer courses. To that aim I have already arranged two Branch Treasurer courses and applied for two Branch Management courses which I am awaiting confirmation from Membership Training.

The Branch Treasurer courses are to be held over the weekend of 1st and 2nd December 2018 in the Area Office in Southampton and 5th and 6th January 2019 in Farnborough RBL Club.

Candidates can submit application forms for these courses to me. I will let the membership know of the dates for the Branch Management courses as soon as I have confirmation.

Further to the more general training organised by me there is also the more specialist training arranged through other. For all Branch Community Support related training members should contact Committee Vice-Chairman at Hampshire.vicechairman@rbl.community or through the Area Office on 0808 802 8080. For all training related to Recruiting Officer members

should contact Principal Recruiting Officer at Hampshire.cro@rbl.community. Finally, for all training relating to Standard Bearers and Parade Marshals members should contact County Parade Marshal at stevemo@stevemo.plus.com.

It is my intention, as soon as possible, to develop training capabilities within the county to enable us to run our own training thus making things a whole lot simpler and enable all branches within the county to have sufficient trained branch officers to cover all eventualities and provide a good example to other counties as to how we function as a county. With this thought in mind I will be pushing for more Branch Treasurer courses so we are able to have a core group of trained personnel who can then go on to become Independent Examiners (IE) and take the pressure off of the County Treasurer who is currently the only IE we have.

MAP & Office 365

Following the implementation of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) in May all Branches should be considering how they protect the data of their members as failure to comply with GDPR can result in reputation damage to the RBL and financial penalties. One way to ensure that Branch Officers do not fall foul of these regulations is by using the Membership Administration Portal (MAP). This portal is a quick way to access membership listings, communicate with other Branch officials and store files. The Membership Administration Portal (MAP) also ensures smooth transition from retiring Branch officers and those succeeding them as the e-mails issued relate to the role and not individual persons thus enabling the new officers to follow any e-mail trails and discussions held relating to them.

E-mails and log in details are available from the Membership Support Officer (MSO) Chris Bolton at Cbolton@britishlegion.org.uk or by ringing the Area Office on 0808 802 8080. Once the log-in details are obtained the lay-out of the MAP is simple with a large amount of information available relating to a wide range of topics including quick start guides of how to navigate the portal as well as application forms for a number of membership related areas.

Branch Officers has strongly encouraged to embrace this important development. If any branch should experience difficulties when accessing and implementing this portal then they should contact the MSO or me at Hampshire.cto@rbl.community . I am willing to visit branches to provide support by giving briefings on the use of MAP's and the associate software.

Fleet, Crookham & District

Saturday 8th September we will be holding a very special evening presentation on a former resident of Church Crookham, Maj Gen Dudley Johnson VC, CB, DSO & Bar, MC. On 8th September his grandson, Lt Col (Ret'd) Andrew Larpent OBE will be giving a presentation to the Branch, open to all with proceeds going to The Poppy Appeal and The VC & GC Association.

On 4th November 1918, Lieutenant Colonel Johnson, commanding the 2nd Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment, led the attack on a lock on the Sambre Canal, France for which he was awarded the VC. Between the wars he held a number of instruction and staff posts before being appointed Commanding Officer of 2nd Bn North Staffordshire Regiment in 1928. He became Commander of 12th (Secunderbad) Infantry Brigade in 1933 and General Officer Commanding 4th Division from 1938 to 1940. He was replaced as divisional commander after Dunkirk and made GOC of Aldershot Command later on in 1940 before becoming Inspector of Infantry in 1941. He retired in 1944 and was Colonel of the South Wales Borderers from 1944 to 1949.

After retiring to Church Crookham in 1944, he held many local positions including Chairman of Fleet Urban District Council and Church Warden of Christ Church, Church Crookham. Buried in the church yard of Christ Church his grave will be refurbished by his family and rededicated on Sunday 11th November, 100 years almost to the day of his VC action.

Mr David Edwin Lloyd – Petersfield Branch



David Edwin Lloyd

David served with the RAF as an Air Communication Technician, enlisting as a Boy Entrant Air Wireless Mechanic in 1957 at RAF Cosford. He served at RAF Seletar – Singapore, RAF Gan – Maldives, RAF Nicosia – United Nations Force in Cyprus, Lusaka – Zambian Air Force, RAF Wildenrath, RAF Gutersloh – Germany, RAF Luqa – Malta, RAF Salalah – Sultan of Oman's Air Force, RAF Goose Bay –

Canada, Belize, Northern Ireland and Rhodesia – Commonwealth Monitoring Team. Home postings include RAF stations Wyton, Thorney Island, Yatesbury, Binbrook, Leuchars, Odiham, Waddington & Marham.

David left the RAF in 1982 and after obtaining a Civil Aviation Licence at Brunel Technical College went on to work in Zimbabwe (Airwork), Saudi Arabia (British Aerospace), United Arab Emirates (Airwork) and RAF Valley (Anglesey). David spent his last six-year working life with Petersfield based 'Compassion in World Farming', which later moved to Godalming.

Now retired, David occupies most of his time as Archivist for the RAF Seletar Association and Secretary for the Petersfield Branch RBL.
