

Minutes of a Meeting held in the Comrades Club
on 20th July 1948

Present. The Chairman (Rev^d C. J. K. Burnell), Messrs Farrow + Nash and the Hon. Secretary.

1. The minutes of the last meeting were read & signed

1a. Arising from the minutes

- (i) The Chairman said he had paid several visits to M^r Mortimer but had not succeeded in finding her: he had seen M^r Millard who was making very good progress to recovery in hospital & did not want any action towards treatment in the special hospital of rheumatology at present. He would like help towards paying taxi fares to & from Dymock but it was suggested that in future the ambulance now stationed in Newcut would be available for him
- (ii) The Hon. Sec. stated he had seen Miss Carter again but she seemed unable to give information about the progress of the proposed action for compensation. The Hon. Sec was asked to seek information from M^r Slade.

(iv) Mr. R. C. Warren. The Chairman had visited him at Clifford's house & obtained from S. C. I. the Hon. Sec. had sent the vouchers granted by the last meeting. Major Farrow said he believed Warren had been to hospital again for examination & might have to undergo further treatment in hospital.

(v) The Hon. Sec^y had seen Mr. Sutton & had also ascertained that the cost of a steerage passage to New York was £41. After some discussion it was decided that the application should lie on the table until Mr. Sutton was able to offer some contribution of his own towards his move to the U.S.A.

(vi) A letter from the County Sec^y ^{was read} stating that efforts on behalf of Mr. Taylor (for whom the hon. solicitor appeared in Court) had not been successful.
