Spitfire Garden - a year-round act of Remembrance

The garden is dedicated to peace in the memory of Flight Lieutenant Frederick Denston, who flew Spitfires during the war.

Frederick first saw the Torbay Coastline from the air just before D-Day and vowed that if he survived the war he would retire there.

He realised his dream with his wife, Peggy. After his death, Peggy created the Spitfire Garden, with help from the local Air Training Corps, and veterans' groups. Sadly, the garden became neglected over time. It was rediscovered, and with the help of local organisations, including RBL Paignton Branch, was restored to its former glory. Paignton Branch hold an annual Act of Remembrance at the garden to remember Frederick and all humanitarian operations carried out by service personnel, past and present, and our emergency services.

These Poppy collectors are part of a selection of knitted items from St. Marychurch, Torquay. The two figures are based on current Legion members, Lionel Digby and Jo Sharrott. Jo was instrumental in the Spitfire Garden Project.
