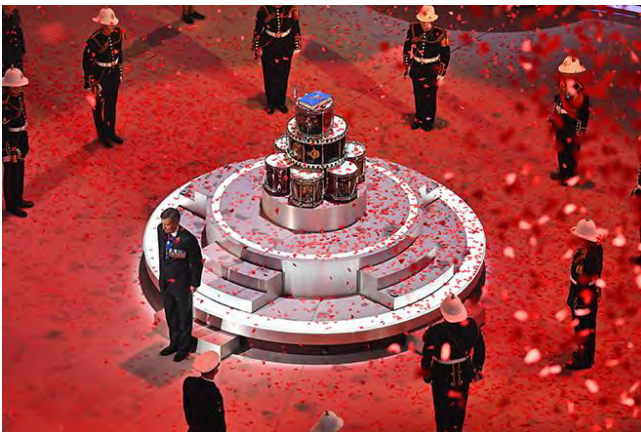

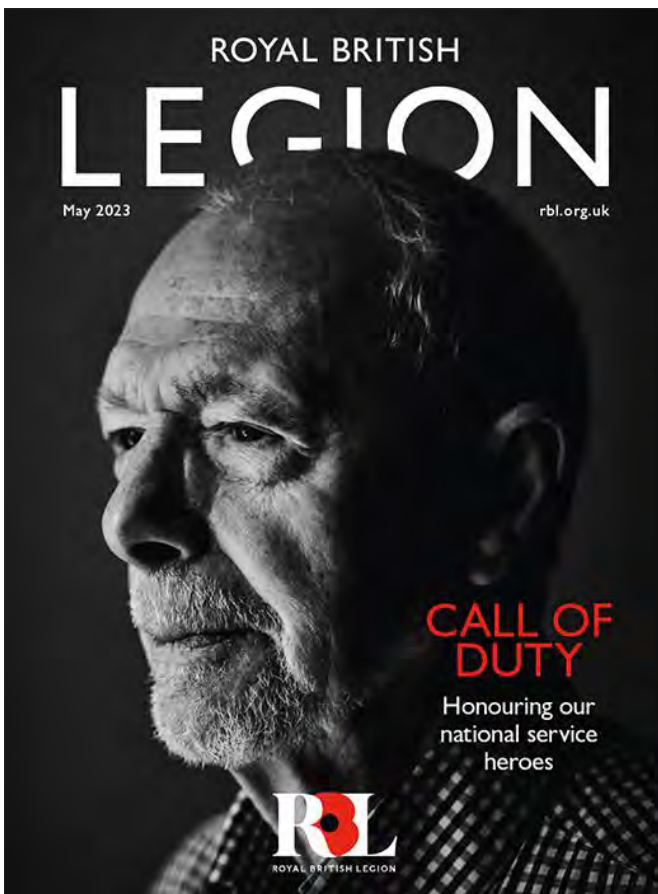

Did you know that...

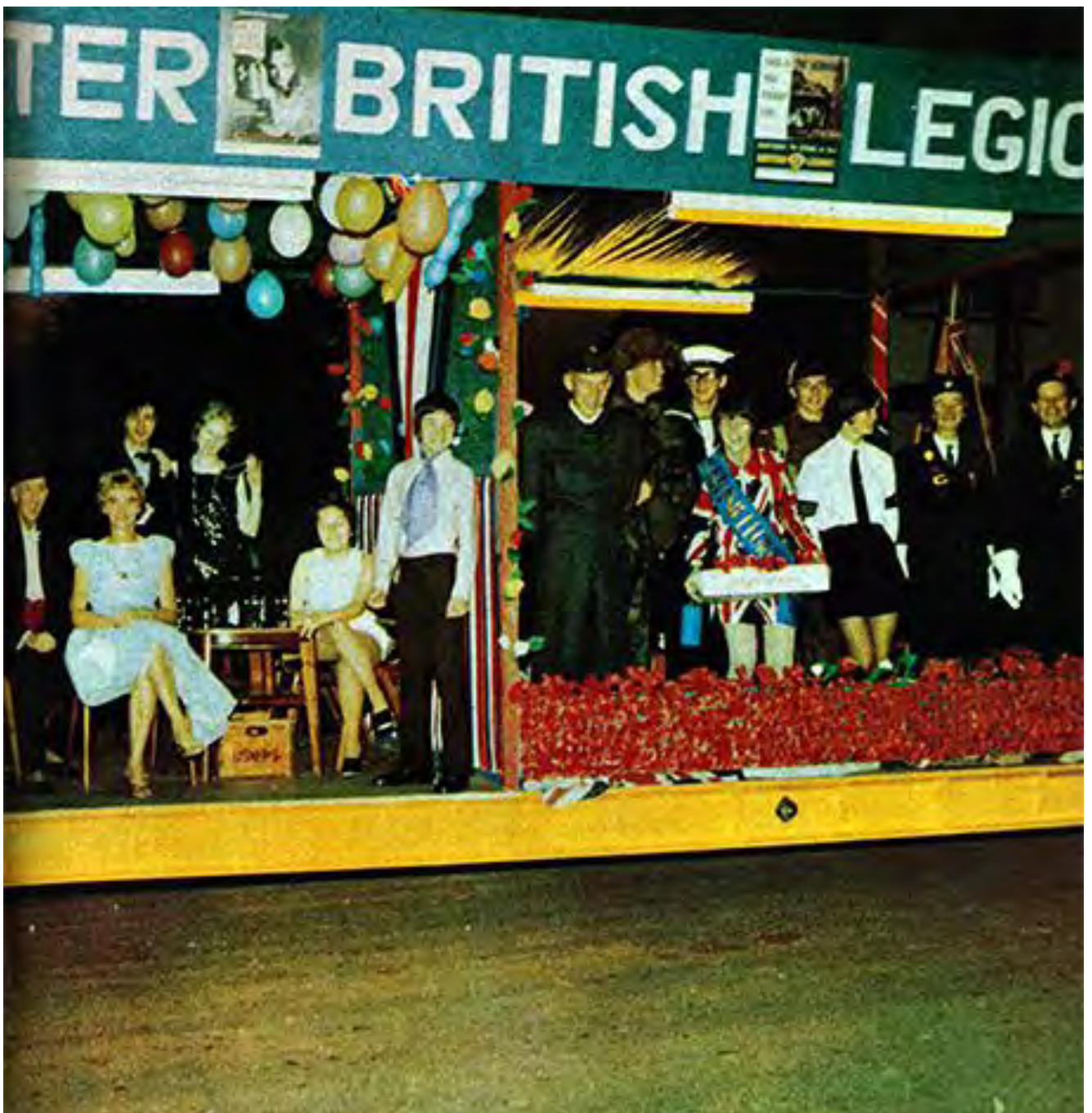


On Saturday 22 April 2023, Dromore Branch of The Royal British Legion hosted a Charity Concert to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. Guests included the National Vice-Chair and Trustee, Ms Lynda Atkins; the Vice-Chair of the Membership Council, Ms Patsy Wilkinson; the Deputy Lord Lieutenant of County Down, Mr Duncan McCausland and, most importantly, Mr Jim Gibson. He is a very young 100-year-old and a World War Two Veteran who served in the Royal Navy. The Branch raised the princely sum of £4000, which was divided between the Poppy Appeal and Branch Funds.



Anne-Marie Cobley (second from left) was among 100 RBL Standard Bearers who formed a Guard of Honour in Parliament Square as part of the Coronation Procession on Saturday 6 May. She is the third generation in her family to be involved with RBL. She said: "It was such a huge honour and privilege to be there. It's really hard to put into words how I felt. "The best part was seeing all the Royal Family going past. We were the first people to see the newly crowned King and Queen. "It's something I'll never forget. I've got two young granddaughters, so they can look back at this moment in history and say their nanny was there."

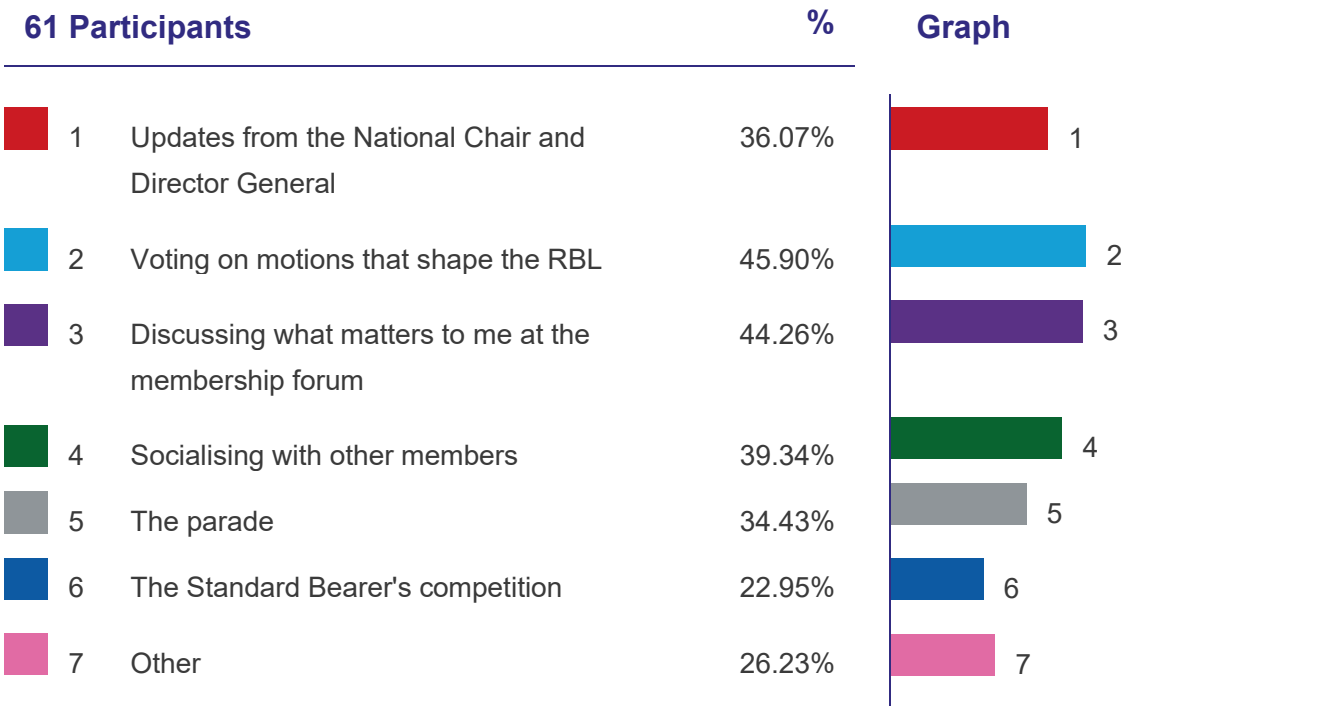
