## V E Day 80

Thank you to all members, helpers, volunteers and organisations that supported the VE Day 80 events at the United Reformed Church on 5<sup>th</sup> May and the RBL Club lunch event on 8<sup>th</sup> May.

The URC event was well attended and the stall holders all raised good funds for their various causes, raising in total £695.63 (we are still waiting a total for refreshments by Jam Pot Community but that did very well – they had to keep going back to ASDA for more bacon!!). The Stowmarket Concert Band put on a great show for us and the short ceremony, led by Reverend Richard Stretch, with the Parade Marshal, Branch and Veteran Standards Bearers in attendance, aptly concluded a day of celebration and reflection. Local World War 2 Veteran Jim Grant, who turned 100 last December, was not able to be with us, as he had invitations to attend the events in London at Buckingham Palace; it was great that Jim was able to attend those 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations

It was a good service, great to experience the atmosphere and we caught up with a few people we knew within the RBL as we came away. This will be a memorable event and a highlight during my time as Branch Chair.

#### **George Ward Service**

On Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May, the Branch President, David Matthews, Branch Secretary, Fiona Buchele and Branch Deputy Standard Bearer Gary Quinn attended the annual George Ward Service at Onehouse Church, where Sgt George Ward is buried organised by the 1331 Squadron Air Training Corps. Sgt George Frederick Ward was a member of 1331 Squadron in the early 1940s and unfortunately died when his aircraft, a Halifax bomber, JD105 crashed in North Yorkshire.



## NATIONAL CONFERENCE – 16<sup>TH</sup> – 18<sup>TH</sup> May at Harrogate

Harrogate is a great spa town with lots of eateries and a couple of great parks/ open spaces and of course RHS Harlow Carr gardens. On the Friday we attended the RBL Women's Section forum which is always a friendly and enjoyable occasion, meeting up with members and friends from all over the country. The Women's Section continue to carry out great fund-raising for the welfare schemes and donated £150,000.00 towards refurbishment of the family room in each of the six RBL Care Homes. During the past year the Women's Section had made other welfare payments and grants (President's Scholarship Award, Welfare Grants and WS Allowance) totalling £220,384.88. This is in addition to their ongoing support to the friends and family of the Invictus Games competitors.

At the RBL Conference on the Saturday, the RBL launched their new 10 years strategy. The "strategy on a page" document, a double-sided colour document summarising the strategy was sent out to all members with a registered email address (and opted into communications) on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> May, around lunchtime, so please check your inboxes for this, otherwise, a copy is attached with this email. Of interest to Stowmarket is that as part of the connect and support strategies, the RBL is looking at providing more support to RBL Clubs. In a recent survey of members, 70% identified Clubs as being crucial to the future of the RBL and this has been adopted within the strategy. This is being led by the new Director General of the RBL, who visited Stowmarket Club last August and met members from around Suffolk and took away a

lot of input and constructive comment for consideration; we believe this has helped with developing the strategy, which we look forward to hearing more about over the coming months.


