He said he should know more next week, but there are suggestions that there'll be a huge cost to developing the site and this may delay matters further. Nothing is likely to happen until the end of this year or the start of 2025. CL did emphasise that it's important we think about the future. He said we could use a local pub, but we should consider all ideas as its important the RBL carry on.	
CL is in the UK soon and hopes to sort out his RBL account. It appears the membership needs to be sorted too, but MB said the RBL had reported they were having trouble with membership nationally.	CL

He thought we it would be appropriate to send a box down with a tin so people don't have to reuse them. This was agreed.
