The Buckinghamshire County on winning the Maurice Cup

The Buckinghamshire County received the Maurice Cup at this year's conference as the County/District/Section that made the most progress during the year. With 33 Branches the County saw a 34% increase in membership and added 885 new Members, while the Committee also encouraged more Branches to sign up to Branch Community Support especially during the pandemic.



The Alicante Branch was awarded the Haig Cup at Conference

This year's Haig Cup was presented to the Alicante Branch, the largest Branch in Spain District North, for their progress and efficiency during the year. Between 2019/2020 and 2020/2021 the Branch recruited 77 new Members going from a total of 175 to 252. The Branch also increased the funds raised by more than 21% in the last financial year and unveiled an RBL centenary memorial.




