Pathfinder Lancaster PB667

On the 20th of March 1945, just 49 days before the war in Europe ended just outside Nieuwdrop in Holland, a British Lancaster crashed with the loss of all the crew; its number was PB667 with a squadron ident of MG-Q. During excavation by builders in 2010, 2 propellers and the engines were found; since then the story of the the crash and the lives of the crew have been researched by member of the local <u>Liberation Museum</u>.

As a result of finding the propellers a memorial on the site of the crash has been erected which is right next to the museum.



The town has honoured crew members by naming roads related to the crash. Also a service of dedication was held May this year.
