

MPs rate us as one of top three campaigning charities

We've recently joined the Not For Profit (NFP) Charity Parliamentary Monitor - a regular survey that asks MPs and peers for their views on the effectiveness of charity campaigning. We scored 80% on our effectiveness score, which put us in third place after Macmillan and Cancer Research UK. Our scores from Labour and Conservative MPs were very similar, demonstrating our cross-party scoring for effectiveness and 51% of MPs are aware of our cost-of-living grants.
