## Visit to Brookwood Cemetery- 8 June 2025

A Sunday afternoon walk in a cemetery is not for everyone, but if you factor in the magic of Brookwood Military Cemetery (BMC), lovely weather and a renowned guide such as Paul McCue, from the Secret War Learning Network, the notion is not so strange.

Brookwood is filled with historic characters in both the military and civilian cemeteries. There are financiers, merchants, gentry, architects, artists, writers, industrialists, sportspeople, engineers - even Haratia Nelson Johnson, Granddaughter of Emma, Lady Hamilton and Haratio Nelson, Julia Lennon (John's Mum) and Cilla Black!

Paul started his Tour at the Memorial to the Missing (MttM), a white circular building inaugurated in 1958 which incorporates carved columns and name plaques of over 3,400 individuals who have no known grave.



Every name has a story, but some stories are better known, Violette

Szabo, GC (codename 'Lise'), SOE Operative for example. Her story is full of daring do, intrigue and sadness. Many books have been written and a film made about her.



Paul gave us a detailed insight into the lesser known facts. For example the story behind the death of 23 Palestinian Jewish volunteers who perished in Operation Boatswain to destroy oil refineries in Tripoli. Their names were added to the Monument to the Missing in May 2017 with full military honours. Or the reason why there were actually 24 names listed, including that of Fortunato Picchi, an Italian born British citizen who was really involved with the SAS in Operation Colossus against the Apulian viaduct near Naples. Despite being 44 years old and very out of shape, Picchi had volunteered as a linguist. He was captured and killed by the Italians for being a traitor to his country despite being a British citizen. His name ended up on the memorial as the result of an administrative error that will take years to correct.

Paul took our group to the Czech and Free French areas of the cemetery telling a myriad of moving and personal stories before ending with refreshments at Eddie Jones' Trench Experience'.

It was an insightful and thought provoking afternoon and an excellent way of spending a Sunday afternoon. Hopefully, it has promoted members to go back to Brookwood or research some of the stories for themselves. - Nigel Payne
