On the 28th October, once again we had a great County Poppy Appeal launch hosted by the Panton family at Lincolnshire Aviation Heritage Centre, East Kirkby. There was a good turnout of standard bearers from across the county. Our own Poppy Appeal Organiser Julian Millington received the Sheppard Trophy, awarded in recognition to dedicated service to Lincolnshire poppy appeal, presented by the County President Gary Headland and County Chairman John Johnson. The event ended with live taxi runs and poppies released from WW2 Lancaster Bomber NX611 'Just Jane'.

Thanks to Julian Millington and many volunteers we had a successful Poppy Appeal. As usual a 2 minutes silence was held in the market square on Armistice Day.

We had lots of positive feedback about our Remembrance Day parade, Remembrance service at the War Memorial Hospital and our Korean Veterans' service at Hamerton Gardens.

Horncastle Community Choir put on an afternoon concert on 11th November to help fund raise for the Poppy Appeal. The event raised £270 for the Poppy Appeal.

6th June 2024 marks 80 years since the D-Day Landings and the Battle of Normandy that led to the liberation of France and Europe. The Royal British Legion will be marking the 80th anniversary with events in the UK and Normandy. Horncastle & District RBL are forming an Events Committee to discuss ideas on how to commemorate the 80th anniversary and to plan events within the local community.
