#### Your Branch Community Support Representative is Hugh King

Providing a most important first tier of support services offered by the Royal British Legion, the role of Branch Community Support is that of the post previously known as the Welfare Officer. The work still majors on improving the welfare of RBL members whether members of the Dereham & District Branch or not, including home or hospital visits, telephone contact, bereavement support or referral to the relevant body for access to additional help.

The difference between the current role and the old role is that the BCS logs all activity undertaken by the Branch and submits reports\* to the Committee, the Branch and the BCS National Representative. These reports include welfare, but in addition note attendance at funerals by the Standard Bearer, Branch activity including recruitment, promoting the Legion, improving our status within the community, attendance at Ceremonial parades, events and social activity such as speakers at Branch meetings, Bingo nights, bowls nights and celebratory events.

Supporting beneficiaries and their families has long been a core activity for the Branch and remains very important. In recent years research has shown that loneliness and social isolation can have a significant impact upon an individual's health and wellbeing. The information reported to both the Committee and the Branch facilitates decision making on future activities to ensure this help continues and it also enables National to improve help and referral processes for members to access the most appropriate service. \*Note: No confidential information is included in the reports

#### **Snapshot of Life in India in November 1945**

Les Dunger, Branch Standard Bearer, has kindly shared a letter from his father Dick to his mother Ethel. It gives a snapshot view of life in India in November 1945. A transcript is shown for ease of reading.

4-11-45 Dear Ethel,

Just a few lines in answer to your letter which I received yesterday. Well I hope by the time you get this letter that you are better. Tomorrow we have got to march back to the last place I was at, it is thirty-two miles and we have got to go across country over the hills and they are hills not like those you see in England and its all jungle. We have got mules to go with us to carry water. Yesterday I went to Brigade sports just outside Ranchi and I went to the pictures at night and saw Hollywood Canteen it was very good. When we were coming back we saw a leopard it went straight across the road in front of us. The other day they ask for volunteers for boot repairing so I put down for it, we have to go on a months course to learn and we should go to Poona that's one of the best places in India, that will be a better job than doing guards and square bashing. It is very hot during the day and it is just the opposite at night we wear a wool vest a shirt and a pullover and three blankets, we have been told that they are going to issue us with sheets the army must be coming

Well I shall have to close now as it is getting dark, hope to hear from you again soon.

#### Is this one of the most unusual WW1 Memorials?

At the end of the nineteenth century Heligan's thousand acres in Cornwall were at their peak, but when the current squire John Tremayne died childless the grounds started to fall into disrepair and only a few years later were terribly neglected. The outbreak of WW1 contributed to the estate's demise as its workforce went off to fight, many sadly never to return. The estate was never sold or developed, then in the 1970s the House was sold and split into apartments, but by this time the gardens had become "lost". It was not until the hurricane in the 1990s that a tiny room buried under fallen masonry in the corner of one of the walled gardens was discovered – the gardeners' thunderbox (toilet). Inscribed into the limestone walls barely visible were the words "Don't come here to sleep or slumber" with the names of those who worked there signed under the date August 1914. It would seem they had signed their names just before going off to war. The discovery of this small room and the names of the men who had used it was inspiration for the renovation of "The lost gardens of Heligan"

In 2013 the Imperial War Museum recognised the Thunderbox Room as a living memorial to the gardeners of Heligan House and on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2014 the memorial plaque was unveiled in the presence of relatives of those who lost their lives and staff from Heligan.

I don't think the irony of where the Thunderbox Room Memorial is situated would have been lost on those men's sense of humour.





#### THE THUNDERBOX ROOM

This is where the signatures of past outdoor staff were discovered in 1990. Under one column of names was the date, August 1914. Some of those named were later found on local war memorials. Though exposure to light over the past quarter of a century has faded their marks here now, we honour these men and boys who gave their lives for King and Country...

CHARLES BALL -JOHN GEORGE BARRON-PERCY CARHART-CHARLES DYE WILLIAM ROBINS GUY-ALBERT HENRY ROWE-LEONARD WARNE

There are others too, without evidence here, but recorded in the Heligan Estate Labour Books who served and fell WILLIAM SAMUEL HUNKIN-WILLIAM GEORGE PERRY

In total 9 lost, more than one third of the whole outdoor team. We also honour those Heligan men who served their country and returned...

FRED PAYNTER, stone mason-ARCHIBALD SMALDON, carpenter-JOHN VAREY, gardener
